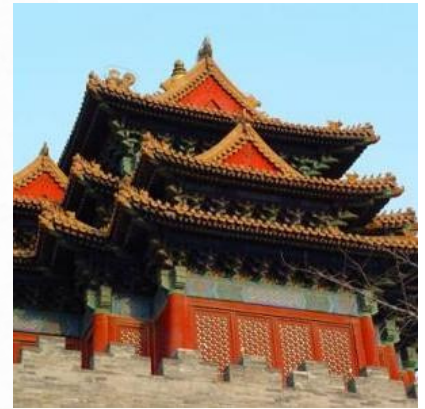


## Study Abroad in China

### About the Program and Local Scene

If the word “China” only conjures up images of the Great Wall and Giant Pandas, then you are in for a world of discovery when you travel to the Far East. Here you’ll discover everything that China has to offer - from ancient Chinese architecture to traditional Chinese art to delicious Chinese cuisine.

Jilin University, located in Changchun, the capital city of the Jilin province, is home to over 60,000 students including 1,400 international students. Changchun, a relatively young city, is known as the “city of movies” - it is the center of Chinese film production and home to the Changchun Film festival. Its ideal winter climate also makes Changchun a mecca for winter sports. It’s the perfect location to suit all of your interests!



### Academics

While the majority of regular University courses offered at Jilin University are in Chinese there are specially designed language courses for you to take in Jilin’s pre-university language program. These courses are the perfect way to improve your Chinese proficiency in reading, writing, and speaking.

### Housing and Meals

You will be housed in one of Jilin University five halls of residence for international students on campuses. Rooms are furnished with necessary facilities such as bed, bookshelf, chair, desk, satellite-TV, telephone, and the Internet. Meals can be prepared in shared kitchens in the residence halls or purchased at local eateries.

### Admission Requirements

A complete application package includes: application, your most recent transcript, a one-page personal statement, and two letters of recommendation (one must be from a Chinese language professor). Admission is open to majors of all disciplines, but students must have completed 2 semesters of Chinese language. Please contact Rutgers Study Abroad for an application packet.

### Program Cost:

Approximately \$11,500. The program costs include all tuition, fees, housing, orientations, administrative fees and medical insurance. The program costs do not include travel to and from China, meals, personal expenses.
