Course objectives:

This course is designed to enhance students' understanding of Korea and their Korean proficiency through diverse readings and discussions. Readings will be focused on cultural and social subjects. To widen and deepen your understanding of the subjects, supplementary readings such as newspaper articles and journals will be provided. Other media sources will be used in class as well.

About the course:

- * **Attendance:** A significant portion of your grade will depend on active class work. Therefore, attendance is mandatory. You will fail the class if you are absent 5 or more times. Three late arrivals will count as one absence.
- * **Discussion:** Class discussions will be conducted in Korean. There will be a small group discussion of 3-4 people at the end of each lesson. You will be provided a list of discussion topics at the beginning of each class. However, any topics relevant to the lesson are welcome.
- * **Presentation:** Each student will give at least one presentation during the course. A summary or outline of your presentation must be provided both to the teacher and your fellow students. Other audio-visual aids are strongly encouraged. Presentation time range is in between 10 to 15 min per person.
- * **Short Compositions:** Your weekly homework includes a one page long, response paper written in Korean. You can select any topic from the lesson and must submit 7 papers total during this course. You can submit

2 more papers for extra credit. Please hand in the composition at the end of each lesson.

- * **Quizzes:** There will be 5 times of vocabulary quizzes (including short answer questions). Vocabulary lists will be given in advance.
- * No make-up tests or classes will be permitted.
- * Late homework will be reduced to 50% of the grade you would have received. No papers will be accepted more than one class period late.
