### Course Description:

This course aims to help students develop their language skills in four areas-speaking, listening, reading, and writing-in Korean at the advanced level. It covers grammar and vocabulary, reading comprehension, fluency, conversation manners, and public speaking. Emphasis will be on the appropriate use of Korean in a variety of situations including schools, companies, and formal/informal meetings. This course also enables students to understand Korean culture and history and to develop cross-cultural insights by comparing Korean society with US society. Korean history, image of Korea, and current social trends in Korea will be discussed for a solid understanding of Korean culture in which Korean language is embedded.

(1) **Class participation (5%) and Attendance (5%):** Students are required to read the assigned materials for each week and be prepared to discuss them in class. Class attendance is required. If you are 15 minutes late for class, this will be counted as a half absence. Students are expected to attend every class and arrive on time. Poor attendance, frequent lateness and early departure will affect your grade. If your absences exceed 5 classes, you may fail the course. If your absences exceed 2 classes, you will not receive an A regardless of your semester scores. 2 late arrivals equal one absence.

(2) **Assignment (20%):**

1) Students must submit **two free writing essays every Monday** starting from 9/15. The topic may be given by instructor. Essays will NOT be graded based on accuracy of grammar, vocab., and/or etc, however, adequate grammar, vocab., and expressions level and organization skills for 300 level Korean are required (at least 1 double spaced page, use a notebook, do not submit by a sheet of a paper.) (7%).

2) All students are required to write two short essays. Topics will be given by instructor (2 double spaced pages, 12pts), (10%).

3) Students should also submit assignments given by instructor on time. Late submission will result in partial credits (3%).

(3) **Presentation (5%)**: All students are required to give an oral presentation. Additional instructions will be given in class.

(4) **Final Project and Final Project Presentation (15%)**:

For the final project, students should choose one theme related to Korea and design their own theme-based touring routes. The final project paper should be 4 to 5 pages (12pts, double space) long. Students should not repeat existing materials from any other media including Internet, T.V. programs, books, magazines or movies. If the paper does not show creativity compared to existing ones, the lowest grade will be given to the paper regardless of other strong points. It will be due on **Tuesday, December 15, 11:59 PM.**

### Class Policy:

- (2) You should have done homework assignments before class to participate fully in the classroom activities. Late homework will cause deduction in Homework score.
