ユースの目的 (Course Objectives):

This course is a continuation of Elementary Japanese 101. The goal of this course is to:

- 1. Further develop the four language skills: speaking, listening, reading, and writing in Japanese;
- 2. Speak and write about yourselves and topics of personal relevance to you by using variety of sentence patterns and vocabulary words;
- 3. Develop communication skill through learning Japanese;
- 4. Have an understanding of traditional and pop Japanese culture through learning Japanese.

In particular, you will be able to: Say your own opinions; pass on information you hear; make plans for travel or parties; say your opinions on past events; order at restaurants; give reasons; describe plans; discuss transportation means and times; make reservations at travel agencies; talk about things you want to do; introduce friends; ask/talk about hometowns; talk about your dreams and future; explain sicknesses; give advice; predict the weather; make phone calls; make promises; say what you can and cannot do; talk about part-time jobs; talk about giving/receiving gifts; and talk about special occasions.

しゅっせき じゅんび じゅぎょうさんか 出席/準備/授業参加 (Class Attendance/Preparation/ Participation): 5%

This is an intensive language class. You will not receive an A without coming to classes regularly. Coming to class more than 10 minutes late (or leaving early) is regarded as 1/3 absence, and missing a class for more than 40 minutes is considered to be one absence. The first three absences will not be penalized. However, from the fourth absence on, each will lower your overall grade by one percentage point. Your absences will not be penalized if you have official reasons with supplemental documents. Prior to each lesson (see the attached schedule), you **must be prepared** (meaning read the grammar explanations in the textbook and memorize the vocabulary). As for participation, your ACTIVE class participation (not necessarily raising your hand all the time, but paying attention and being engaged in pair/group work) is expected. Please refrain from using cellphones or laptops unless there is an emergency. You do not need a laptop during the class. Minimal use of English is expected as well. If you work on other subjects during a class (opening another class's textbook counts!), you will not get a participation point for that class.

宿題 (Homework Assignments): 20%

Most assignments are from the workbook. For listening exercises in the workbook, you need to go to the language lab or the website at https://sakai.rutgers.edu. Your assignments need to be turned in at the beginning of the class. If you work on your homework during the class time, it will not be accepted. Late assignments will be accepted only within 2 days of the deadline with a 20% deduction. All of your work has to be original. If you copy homework from anyone or show it to anyone, you will not get any credit.

Your instructor will highlight the answers you got wrong and mark for error correction (see below). If there are too many mistakes and your instructor considers that you did not quite understand the material, you will be asked to RESUBMIT (再) the assignment. In that case, carefully go over the assignment again and resubmit it in a timely manner. You will not get a credit for the assignment until you resubmit.
